

ORDINANCE NO. 27-2009

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COMMITTEE OF TOWNSHIP OF HARRISON,
COUNTY OF GLOUCESTER, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 214 ENTITLED
“VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC” OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF HARRISON**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Committee, Township of Harrison, have determined that certain amendments and additions to Chapter 214 entitled “Vehicles and Traffic” are necessary; and

WHEREAS, via Resolution No. 29-2009, the Harrison Township Planning Board granted final major subdivision approval for the project commonly known as Tomlin Station Commerce Center, Phase II, affecting Block 46, Lots 3.02, 3.03, 3.04 and 4.01; and

WHEREAS, as a condition of approval, Paragraph 30 of the Harrison Township Planning Board’s Resolution required the Applicant, Woodland Four, L.L.C., to install two (2) stop signs at the intersection of Myers Drive and Route 322, and Myers Drive and Tomlin Station Road and to prohibit parking along Myers Drive; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Planning Board Engineer has, under his seal as a licensed professional engineer, certified to the Township Committee of the Township of Harrison the following:

- (a) the designation of these intersections as stop intersections and the erection of the stop signs has been approved by him after investigation of the circumstances;
- (b) the designation of these intersections as stop intersections and the erection of the stop signs appears to the Municipal Planning Board Engineer to be in the interests of safety for the residents and the expedition of traffic on the public highways; and
- (c) the signage conforms to the current standards prescribed by the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways as adopted by the Commissioner of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, in all other respects Chapter 214 entitled “Vehicles and Traffic” shall remain in full force and effect;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Harrison, in the County of Gloucester and State of New Jersey, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same as follows:

Section 1.

§214-14 entitled “Parking prohibited at all times on certain streets” shall be amended to add the following text:

Name of Street	Side	Location
<u>Myers Drive</u>	<u>Both</u>	<u>Entire Length</u>

Section 2.

§214-20 entitled "Stop intersections" shall be amended to add the following text:

Intersection	Stop Sign(s) On
<u>Myers Drive and Route 322</u>	<u>Myers Drive</u>
<u>Myers Drive and Tomlin Station Road</u>	<u>Myers Drive</u>

Section 3.

Severability.

Should any section, clause, sentence, phrase or provision of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 4.

Repealer.

All prior Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

Section 5.

In all other respects, Chapter 214 entitled "Vehicles and Traffic" shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6.

When effective.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with law.
