Recycling Reminders

Are you familiar with the rules of recycling in Harrison Township? If not, here are a few important points to remember.

Curbside Recycling

All trash and recyclable materials will be collected on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday depending on where you live. Place trash (each household is allowed to place four

35 gallon trash containers not weighing more than 50 lbs. each) and recyclables **(there is no limit as to how much recyclables you put out)** curbside after 6:00 p.m. on evenings prior to your collection day. The recycling is single stream, therefore you may commingle those items. The trash must be at least 6 feet away from the recyclables.

Items that are collected curbside are: wood/lumber (including painted and/or treated materials); appliances and metal items; 3) rug, carpet (4ft in length, no more than 50 lbs); household furniture; paper, newspaper, magazines and books; cardboard, plastic, and glass.

Scrap metal items and appliances are collected on the 2nd Wednesday
