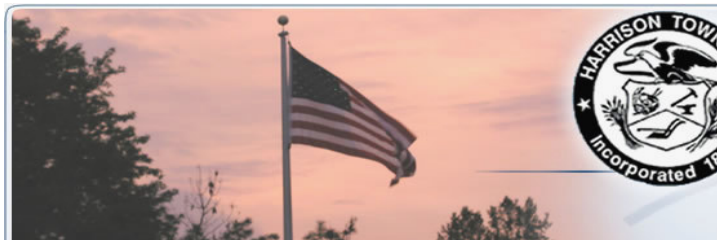
Recycle & support D.A.R.E. in one easy step.

Save a Life

Stroke is the No. 3 cause of death and a leading cause of serious, long-term disability in America. A stroke occurs when the brain does not get enough blood and oxygen due to a blocked or ruptured vessel. When the brain is deprived of oxygen, nerve cells cannot function causing the cells to die within minutes. The damaged nerve cells in the brain are then unable to send signals to the body parts they control. The devastating effects of stroke are often permanent because dead brain cells cannot be replaced. If you think someone is having a stroke, **ACT F.A.S.T!** **F** is for Face. Ask the person to smile. Does one side of their face droop?

A is for Arm. Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward? **S** is for Speech. Is their speech slurred? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence. Is the sentence repeated correctly? **T** is for Time. Call 911 immediately. Time is Brain!

Stroke is a medical emergency. Remember these warning signs of stroke and teach them to others. Every second counts:

1. Sudden numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body;
2. Sudden confusion, trouble speaking or understanding;
3. Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes ;

4. Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination ;
5. Sudden, severe headache with no known cause

If you or someone with you is experiencing signs of a stroke, do not delay! **Call 9-1-1 immediately.** It is very important to take immediate action. The time of the first symptom is important. A clot-busting drug called tissue plasminogen activator (tPA) can reduce long-term disability for the most common type of stroke if it is given within three hours of the symptoms of stroke.
